Notes from Mrs. Biedenbender: Thank you for taking the time to meet for parent-teacher conferences last week. This is our last week with our student teacher, Miss Beam. We have enjoyed having her with us this past quarter!! We have a couple things going on at school this week:

Wednesday, Nov. 8-CEA meeting at 6pm

Thursday, Nov.9-Forensics night at 6pm

Please make a note that <u>next Friday</u>, <u>Nov. 17</u> will be a parent-transport day, so no bus and have your child bring a snack and lunch.

What we are learning this week:

Christ Light: We will learn the stories "Pharaoh Disobeys God" and "The Plagues".

Reading: We will finish up our last stories in our reading book and will begin a new chapter book next week.

Math: 3rd grade will learn how to measure to the nearest quarter inch, figure out "some, some more stories", estimate lengths and distance, and rounding time on a clock to the nearest minute; 4th grade will learn fractions of a dollar, reading fractions and mixed numbers from a number line, and measuring to the nearest quarter inch.

Spelling: 3rd grade spelling words will have the long i sound, spelled with i and igh; 4th grade words have "vowel controlled r's" and special spellings for /aw/ words.

English: 3rd grade will learn about pronouns, possessive pronouns, conjunctions, and sentence fragments.

Social Studies: We will finish learning the southeastern states and their capitals. We will then switch to Science for this second quarter and begin with a lesson about apples.
