We are looking forward to our History Fair this Wednesday, at 6pm. We are looking forward to "meeting" so many people from history!

Just a reminder that this Friday is parent transport and no hot lunch, so your child will need to bring a lunch to school.

We enjoyed having Isaiah as our star of the week last week. This week, the birthday boy Ollie, will have a turn.

Christ Light: Our new stories this week are "The Fall of Jericho" and "Achaan's Sin".

What We Are Learning:

ALL girls and boy ages 9-14 as of January 1st are invited to participate in the local level of competition for the KofC Free Throw Championship sponsored by the local chapter. The local competition will be held at Cathedral gym. Doors open and registration begins at 1:30 with the contest beginning at 2:00 PM.

The Knights of Columbus Free Throw Championship is sponsored annually with winners progressing through local, district, regional, and state competitions. Since its beginning in 1972, over 2.5 million youths have participated in the contest. All boys and girls will shoot 15 free throws.
