We said farewell to Miss Schobe and Miss Hueske as they now start classes this week at MLC. We thank them for their time at Trinity and leading us through various classes. The students did a great job at the Academic fair last week and properly shared information about their person.

THIS WEEK IN THE UPPER GRADE CLASSROOM:

This is what we have coming up in some classes:

Math - Everybody will have a test on Monday and Tuesday this week.

Social Studies - The 7/8th graders are getting closer to our discussion of World War 1. We will look into the events that lead up to it, battles during, and how it ended.

Spelling - This week we have Lesson 17 and a test on Friday.

Religion - We will be starting up our student-led lessons for the next month or two. Each of the students will have two lessons they will be sharing with a partner. They have been working on these on and off and will be reminded when their lesson approaches.

I apologize for the late notice, there was a misunderstanding with last week's News and Notes, so I was not able to give a heads-up this way last week. We will be going to the Capitol and Ronald McDonald House this Wednesday. We will leave shortly after school starts and then be back before the end of the school day. First, we will drop off our tabs, and they will give a brief tour of their facility outside (age restrictions and health concerns do not permit us to go inside).
