THIS WEEK IN THE UPPER GRADE CLASSROOM:

This is what we have coming up in some classes:

Spelling - This week we have Lesson 24. There is no test this week.

MN History -Now that we are done with Minnesota History, we will be switching gears to World History. Our first section is on Africa. We will briefly look over this continent and learn where many of the countries are!

Reading - This week we will be watching the movies from our books. The students will then complete a compare and contrast essay and offer their opinion on whether the movie should be watched or not.




Reading: We continue to read our novel "Because of Winn-Dixie" by Kate DiCamillo.

Math: Our Math homework has been a little more challenging this quarter because we have been learning many new things! We keep practicing our past lessons and math facts everyday, and keep improving in the memorization of our multiplication and division facts! This week the 3rd grade will learn about odds and even numbers, division, and equal group stories; 4th grade will learn how to multiply two 2-digit numbers, getting remainders from division problems, mixed numbers and improper fractions.

English: 3rd grade will learn how to write directions and review classifying sentences; 4th grade will learn about indirect objects and descriptive writing. **Spelling:** 3rd grade spelling words have double consonants in the middle of them; 4th grade words are singular and plurals.

What We Are Learning:
