# THIS IS HOW WE KNOW GOD LIVES IN US

How can we be confident that God will follow through on all his promises to us? Simple: Jesus lives! If God faithfully fulfilled every ancient word he spoke about Jesus, then not a single word he speaks to us will be forgotten. If he raised the dead to indestructible life, then none of his promises are too big. If he has exalted Jesus in all glory and honor, then he will one day give us glory and honor, too. Our living Savior is the proof we need, and all our confidence rests in him.

Today he tells us, "My grace is powerfully at work in you." But sometimes his power is hard to see. We struggle with uncertainty about our faith, our forgiveness, our needs. We look at our life and see less improvement, less love, less selfless service than we would like. And if it's up to us to make God's grace fruitful, that's where we'll be stuck. But the risen Jesus gives us something much better to rely on: "If you remain in me and I in you, you will bear much fruit." Jesus dwells in us by his Spirit, and as he continues to speak to us in his Word, his love works powerfully in us and through us.

#### THE MISSION OF TRINITY

The members of Trinity are joined together in Jesus' love to **worship** our Lord, **grow** in his Word, and **share** it with others.

#### WE WILL CELEBRATE THE LORD'S SUPPER IN TODAY'S SERVICE.

St. Paul writes that everyone who receives the Lord's Supper must "recognize the body of Christ," and therefore "ought to examine themselves" (1 Cor. 11:27-29) before eating and drinking. He also writes that it is God's desire that as his people commune, they do so as "one body" (1 Cor. 10:17), "perfectly united in mind and thought" (1 Cor. 1:10). For this reason, Trinity follows the biblical and historic practice of closed (or member) communion. We welcome members of WELS or ELS congregations to commune with us. If you are not a member of a church in fellowship with Trinity, please refrain from communing today. We want nothing more than to receive the Lord's Supper with you, but we want to do so in the unity of faith that Jesus wants for his people (cf. John 17:20-23). We hope that can happen soon! Please speak to our pastor after the service, and he would be happy to further explain our practice and help you work toward full unity with us.

# **HOLY BAPTISM**

Remain seated

In the name of the Father and of the + Son and of the Holy Spirit. **Amen.** 

#### **Confession**

Our Savior Jesus Christ commanded Baptism when he said, "All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. Therefore go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you. And surely I am with you always, to the very end of the age."

All of us are born into this world with a deep need for Baptism. From our parents we inherit a sinful nature; we are without true fear of God and true faith in God and are condemned to eternal death. But while we were still sinners, Christ died for us. He took away our sin by giving his life on the cross. In Baptism, he clothes us with the robe of his righteousness and gives us a new life. We recall what Baptism means for our daily lives:

Baptism means that the sinful nature in us should be drowned by daily sorrow and repentance, and that all its evil deeds and desires be put to death. It also means that a new person should daily arise to live before God in righteousness and purity forever.

As baptized children of God, we confess our sins:

Holy God, gracious Father,

I am sinful by nature

and have sinned against you in my thoughts, words, and actions.

I have not loved you with my whole heart:

I have not loved others as I should.

I deserve your punishment both now and forever.

But Jesus, my Savior, paid for my sins

with his innocent suffering and death.

Trusting in him, I pray: God, have mercy on me, a sinner.

#### Silence for meditation and reflection

God saved us through the washing of rebirth and renewal by the Holy Spirit and united us to the death and resurrection of Jesus. Every day God forgives your sins, removes your guilt, and strengthens you to defeat Satan's power. His promise is for you and your children, and he will never forsake you. Your sins are forgiven. You are clothed with Christ. You are at peace with God now and forever.

Risen Savior, feed our faith with the message of your resurrection. Come to us in your Word and the feast of your sacrament to sustain and strengthen us until we feast with you in eternal glory. Amen.




Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.


#### Lord's Prayer


