THE WAY BACK HOME: DON'T DELAY!

When a wayward child wanders far from home, a loving parent wants nothing more than for him or her to come back home. Likewise, when we wander from God, he eagerly desires to welcome us back home. But he doesn't just passively wait for us to return. He opens the door *and* lovingly pursues us to show us how we can come back through it: ***The Way Back Home***.

Today, God shows us that his patience and grace toward us is not an excuse for indifference. ***Don't Delay*** your return on the way back home! The time we have to return to him in faith is not unlimited. Eventually there will be a day when we are called to account. And yet that day has not yet come. God is still with us, present in the lives of his children. The way back to him remains open. So let's not abuse his patience and waste the time he so graciously gives us! Let's repent and return and respond to his love *now*. Let's live in and enjoy the salvation he longs for us to have.

He also writes that it is God's desire that as his people commune, they do so as "one body" (1 Cor. 10:17), "perfectly united in mind and thought" (1 Cor. 1:10). For this reason, Trinity follows the biblical and historic practice of closed (or member) communion. We welcome members of WELS or ELS congregations to commune with us. If you are not a member of a church in fellowship with Trinity, please refrain from communing today. We want nothing more than to receive the Lord's Supper with you, but we want to do so in the unity of faith that Jesus wants for his people (cf. John 17:20-23). We hope that can happen soon! Please speak to our pastor after the service, and he would be happy to further explain our practice and help you work toward full unity with us.



1 Corinthians 10:1-13

¹For I do not want you to be ignorant of the fact, brothers and sisters, that our ancestors were all under the cloud and that they all passed through the sea. ²They were all baptized into Moses in the cloud and in the sea. ³They all ate the same spiritual food ⁴and drank the same spiritual drink; for they drank from the spiritual rock that accompanied them, and that rock was Christ. ⁵Nevertheless, God was not pleased with most of them; their bodies were scattered in the wilderness.

⁶Now these things occurred as examples to keep us from setting our hearts on evil things as they did. ⁷Do not be idolaters, as some of them were; as it is written: "The people sat down to eat and drink and got up to indulge in revelry." ⁸We should not commit sexual immorality, as some of them did—and in one day twenty-three thousand of them died. ⁹We should not test Christ, as some of them did—and were killed by snakes. ¹⁰And do not grumble, as some of them did—and were killed by the destroying angel.

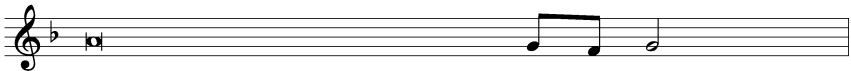
