THIS WEEK IN THE UPPER GRADE CLASSROOM:

This is what we have going on this week:

Spelling - This week we are going through Lesson 22 with a test on Thursday.

US History - They will have a test on Tuesday about the "American Culture" we discussed last week.

Reading - The 7th graders will be starting a new book this week. Ask them later this week what they are starting!
