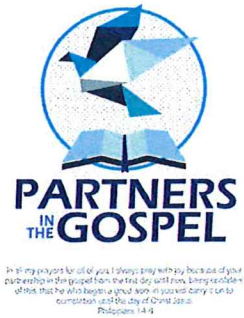

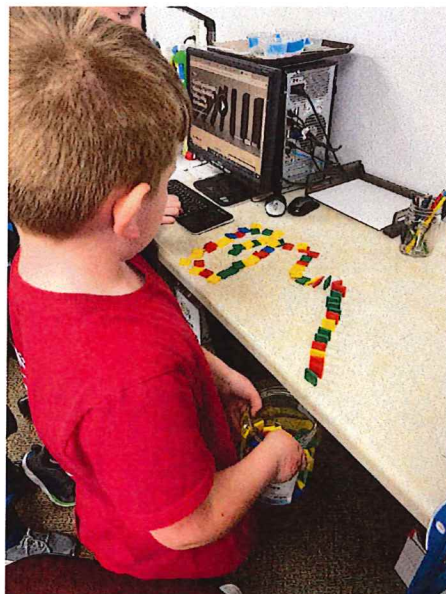
English: 3rd and 4th grade will write a creative story on their Chromebooks, and review editing sentences.

Music: We are working on our songs for our play on Entertainment Night.

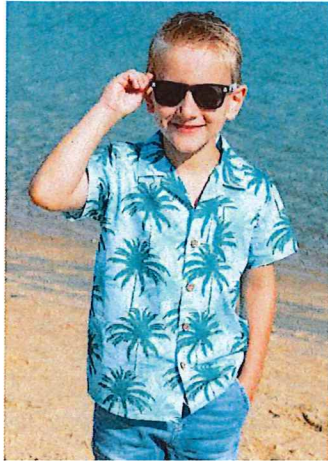
Movement: We are moving our bodies while rolling our fluffballs.
