Mr. Wasser's News

PREVIOUSLY IN THE UPPER GRADE CLASSROOM:

We wrapped up a brief look into evolution and how scientists use information to support the theory. We also looked at what science research supports the Bible and that the earth is not billions of years old, but instead, only a few thousand years. Students are looking at the website, answersingenesis.org and we will discuss their findings as a class next week.

I also shared my expectations for the 5th-6th grade Country Presentation they will be doing in about a week. We will be selecting countries early this week so they can get started on them. The next class after this, they will have a map test on the countries of Latin America and the Caribbean Islands. They need to be familiar with where they are as I will select 15 of them to be located.

THIS WEEK IN THE UPPER GRADE CLASSROOM:

This is what we have going on this week:

Spelling - This week we are going through Lesson 27 with a test on Friday.

World History - Each student will select a country from Latin America and do some simple research on that country. They will take notes and create a presentation for the class. For extra credit, they are able to bring in a signature dish from their country and share with the class. I will send a rubric home with them at the end of the week.

Science - We will be starting our next chapter on renewable and nonrenewable energy. I will be sending home a rubric for an essay and presentation on energy usage and where we get energy from.






